1. Call meeting to order

Meeting called to order at 6:34 pm.

2. Agenda - Additions/Deletions or Adoption

A motion to suspend section 1.1.2 of the bylaws, which currently prevent Watson Road parents who are also staff from voting, was added to the agenda.

Agenda adopted as amended.

3. Approval of minutes from previous annual general meeting

Motion: Leslie Atwell; Seconded: Sabrina Chapman.

Minutes adopted as by acclamation.

4. Special Resolution

- Cheryl Kuyvenhoven reviewed the proposed bylaw amendments, which were circulated by email to the school community two weeks ago.
- "That the Watson Road Elementary Parent Advisory Council membership approves the Watson Road PAC bylaw revisions as written, except for the proposed changes to the lunch program coordinator description (4.6 1), 5.1 and 5.1b)

Bylaw revision approved by acclamation.

5. Suspension of section 1.1.2 of WRPAC bylaws (Leslie Atwell)

- The bylaws currently prevent Watson Road staff at the school, who are also parents of students, from voting at PAC meetings. The PAC has consulted with COPAC, and the section contravenes the School Act. The PAC should amend that section next year.
- Motion to suspend section 1.1.2 of the WRPAC bylaws made by Heather Wice-Hughes; Seconded by Shawna Lees.

The motion was approved unanimously.

6. Principal's Report (Janet Williams)

- The theme this year was Caring Communities, and I think it speaks of what we have at Watson Road.
- Thank you to the outgoing and incoming members of the PAC. They are a vibrant part of our community and work to bring wonderful events to the school. They also bring concerns and wonders to the school to discuss.
- Thank you to Leslie Atwell, who has been at the school nine years and has spent eight of them on the PAC. You have always been level headed, reasonable and have the best interest of students at heart.
- One of the PAC members noted that another school in the district with a similar-sized gym had a
 gym capacity of 720, while Watson Road was recently told the gym capacity was 507. After
 discussions with operations, Watson Road's gym capacity will be increased to just over 700, which
 will be good for dances and school events.
- Learning Updates go home on June 28.
- There will be an assembly on the last day of school, where outgoing staff and the PAC will be acknowledged. There will also be a year-end slideshow, which will also be shared on the school website.
- The theme next year is Wonder.
- We will have 26 divisions next year. There will be no additional portable in the fall, but it is likely for 24-25 school year.
- There will be two combined primary classes and six combined intermediate classes next year.
- We will be starting something new next year—students will be going to their new classroom on the first day of school. You will be getting an email about where your child will be placed.

• It has been a good year overall. We were able to get back to a real sense of normalcy, with a full spring fair. Thanks to Nancy Schofield, Melissa Martin and Tanya Osborne for their work on the

event.

- We were also able to have a school dance again in February and the Grade 6 winter camp happened again. The PAC provided a one-time donation as the costs doubled. The school will be able to use bottle fundraising next year to off-set costs.
- We also had some amazing fundraising this year, with Nicole leading the way. It was great to have a full PAC team for the year.

10. COPAC Report (Mina Petersen)

- Leslie Atwell is now a member at large for COPAC.
- Kevin Kaardal spoke about a replacement for Rutland Middle School. It is not high on the list of school replacements at a provincial level. They are looking at renovations to the structure.
- Lee-Ann Tiede met with Adrian Dix and the Minister of Education.
- The B.C. Fruit and Veggie program used to have 100% coverage, now only 75% will be covered. Schools can choose only 75%, or keep at 100% level and have to top up funds to pay for the fruits and veggies. Watson Road has chosen to stay at 100%, so the PAC may be asked to contribute to the program. The cost would be approximately \$1,000.
- Next year will be the first with an Indigenous course as a requirement for graduation, so students should ensure they have the proper credits to graduate.
- COPAC encouraged PACs to get PST rebates on the expenses they incurred. They have created a how-to guide to assist in the process.

 - Shawna Swayze volunteered to become the new Kiss & Ride Coordinator. Cheryl noted that there are expected to be six vacancies in September, as many volunteers' children will be graduating. Current volunteers spoke about the fun they have volunteering in the role.
